Earlier in March Helen (a professional psychologist in Malawi) started a mentoring program with FOL volunteer lay counselors in Lilongwe. The program is basically equipping the counselors with practical tools and skills that they can use when counseling rape victims and victims of sexual assault in relation to the Malawian culture.

Most of the counselors are not qualified psychologists, they are lay counselors who are interested in counseling and have the passion for it so Helen is sharing her knowledge and experience with the counselors.

One Stop Centre Story

A grandmother brought her 12 year old granddaughter to the One Stop Centre after finding out that her husband raped her. The grandmother cross examined her whether it was the first time this happened to her. The girl admittedly said it had been happening for a long time, about six years in fact.

The granddaughter narrated that every day before he went to work on his shift he would rape her and warned her never to tell anyone or he would kill her. At times he would give her money, buy her clothes and food.

During the counseling session she said that

she was very afraid that once her grandmother found out she would be very angry with her. To her surprise something totally different happened. Her grandmother was very supportive after discovering this and went out of her way to bring her to the hospital to seek help. She is glad that the truth had been revealed because she didn't want to do that anymore and now he will no longer hurt her. The grandmother was very shocked, confused and couldn't believe her husband would hurt an innocent child. During her session she felt like she was a failure for not knowing what was going on for the past six years. She however complained that though she came at the Centre her children were totally against her going to the police to report the incident but she was compelled to do so because she knew that this was the only way her granddaughter would feel safe.

After undergoing counseling, the grandmother said, even though the man in question was her husband, she stood by her granddaughter for she is an orphan and the only guardian available is the grandmother.

Her grandfather is currently under police custody.
